

Introduction:

At the beginning of the late nineteenth century, undivided British rulers in Bengal created the possibility of expanding college level education by resorting to the historical principles of modern education. No university or board of education was formed, there was no other college in the vast area of the north except Rajshahi College.

In this brilliant context of the establishment of the college, one has to be mentioned, with whose enthusiasm and conviction it was possible to establish a timely connection of modern education with the new generation of Pabna – "Shri Gopal Chandra Lahiri". The present geographical boundary of the district has already been marked in the sedimentary soil of the Padma-Jamuna in the district town of Pabna. He opened the door and became the first principal.

In December of that year, his dream came true with the affiliation of Calcutta University as FA Standard College. Mr. Gopal Chandra Maitra, Mr. Ashutosh Roy, Pandit Hari Narayan Kavyartith Vidyabinod and Maulvi Siraj-ul Haq were some of the distinguished associates of Edward College.

The subjects taught were English, History, Logic, Mathematics, Science, Sanskrit, Arabic and Persian. In August 1912, the Governor of Bengal, Lord Thomas David Baron, who visited the college with a donation of Rs. Hemchandra Roy, a very talented professor and poet.

It took more than a decade for Edward College to have its own building and place. Gopi Sundari Dasi and Devendra Narayan Singh, the heirs of Parisundari Dasi, zamindar of Amla Sadarpur in Kushtia, donated 48 bighas of land in AD.

Between 1915-18 AD, the initial work of construction of the college building was completed. In 1914, Rabindranath Tagore, the famous poet, Maharaja Jagadindranath Roy of Natore, Jaldhar Sen, the editor of 'Bharatvarsha', historian Akshay Kumar Maitra, Nalini Ranjan Pandit, Radharman Saha, literary Kishori Mohan Roy, editor of 'Swaraj', Gopalchandra Lahiri, principal of the college, Shashadhar Roy, zamindar of Pabna, Yogendranath Maitra, zamindar of Shitlai and others. The BSc course was started in 1925 after the construction of BSc building in the following year.

After that BA course was opened in 1940 and Biology department was opened in 1948. Honors courses in economics were introduced in Bengal in 1954 and in economics in 1955. With the acquisition of land adjacent to the college in 1981, the total land area was 49 acres and the foundation of physical infrastructure construction work with separate degree building was laid on the new land. Honors courses in Physics, Mathematics and Management were introduced in 1972. MA courses in Bengali and Economics were started in 1983. In 1986, the college was included in '35 government college development projects'. Under this project, extensive

development work was completed. Honors courses in English, Chemistry, Botany, Accounting, Political Science, Philosophy, and History were introduced in 1987.

Masters courses in these 12 subjects were started in 1995. Honors and Masters courses in History and Culture of Islam and Sociology of Islam were started in 1999. Honors and Masters courses in Zoology were started the following year. In August 2013, the Ministry of Education directed to re-open the Higher Secondary Certificate Course in this college and in this regard, the Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Rajshahi, gave the necessary permission to open the branch. In the 2015-2016 academic year, higher secondary education resumed with the admission of a total of 600 students in the branches of science, humanities and business education. At present, the number of students in this college is about 26 thousand. At twilight of the twentieth century, Edward College completed the glorious path of the century.



21st Century has brought the good news of being awarded as the best college at the national level and Edward College has been included in the highest A + category among the government colleges. Under this project construction work of 4 storied Academic Cum Examination Center has already been completed. A total of 160 posts have been created in different departments of the college and some more posts are in the process of creation. Multiple playgrounds, a central library supplemented by 17 seminar libraries, auditoriums and other notable installations exist.

Chapter 1: Overview of the College

Government Edward College is one of the best educational institutes of Bangladesh located in the heart of Pabna city surrounded by greenery along the banks of Ichhamati river. About 26,000 students of Honors, Masters and Degree Pass courses in 18 subjects are studying in this educational institution. Among the colleges affiliated to the National University, it has achieved the honor of being ranked 2nd in the whole of Bangladesh in 2017.



Following this, in 2017, many teachers and students of the college including the principal have been awarded various prizes at local, regional and national level. As the talent has signed, it is currently making a significant contribution to the implementation of the global agenda and building a digital Bangladesh. Although the higher secondary admission process has been stopped since 1996, the higher secondary course has been re-introduced from the 2015-16 academic year. So that the golden children of Pabna can win the competition for admission in the specific target institutions of engineering, medical and higher education. In addition to the specified syllabus, Sahitya Sanskriti Kendras for the study of literature and culture, Cyber Centers for acquiring skills on ICT, Foreign Language Centers for teaching 5 foreign languages including English language have been established.





The college also has Rover Scouts, BNCC, Youth Red Crescent, Girls Guide and Bonding Units as voluntary activities and students are participating in these activities extensively. The new Shaheed Minar and Drishtinandan Swadhinata Memorial have been constructed and the work of setting up the Liberation War Archive Center is in progress.

There are separate committees in each department for the purpose of ensuring that the school is free from terrorism and militancy. Rabindra Sangeet, Nazrul Sangeet, Patriotic Song, Poetry Recitation, Dance, Folk Music, Presentation Speech, Solo Performance, Debate Competition.



Always trying. College area has already been brought under wi-fi to make internet facility easily available to students. the celebration of the national days.


